

**5<sup>th</sup> ANNUAL INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON LAW AND  
ADMINISTRATIVE JUSTICE FROM AN INTERDISCIPLINARY  
PERSPECTIVE**

Between 23<sup>rd</sup> - 25<sup>th</sup> November 2018, National University of Political Studies and Public Administration (NUPSPA), Faculty of Public Administration (FPA), Department of Law “Victor Dan Zlătescu”, Bucharest, Romania in partnership with Charles University, Faculty of Social Sciences, Prague, Czech Republic and the Romanian Association for the United Nations (ANUROM) member of the World Federation of the United Nations Associations (WFUNA) together with the members of the European Law Institute (ELI) – Hague/Vienna and the International Institute of French Law Expression and Inspiration (IDEF) - Paris organized the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual International Conference on Law and Administrative Justice from an Interdisciplinary Perspective.

The conference was a real success and brought to the attention of specialists important topics: The Administrative Capacity of the Judicial System; Human Rights in the New Era; Citizenship and Immigration in Europe; New Tendencies in Public Administration Development; Climate Change: Global Challenges, Local Actions; Peaceful Settlement of Conflicts and Management.

In the opening session chaired by Associate Professor PhD Mihaela Victorița Căraușan, Vice Dean of the FAP-NUPSPA, Peter Juptner, PhD Professor from the Faculty of Social Sciences, Charles University, presented New Tendencies in Public Administration Development in the Czech Republic.

From the first topic, The Administrative Capacity of the Judicial System, we recall the studies: “The General Court – The Tendency to Become a Common Jurisdiction” presented by the chair of working-group, Professor Irina Moroianu Zlătescu PhD, titular member of the International Academy of
